Starfish Connect – Early Alert	Priscilla Mora For Fall 2022, faculty submission of Starfish Early Alert reports hovered around 20% of all faculty across all three colleges. This is a significant normalization of Starfish in the district in that previously, only Oxnard had been at the 20% completion level. However, we are not seeing significant changes in that percentage over time. The next effort the Starfish Workgroup is making is to gather data to share regarding the impact of Starfish reports on student success. With that data, we may be able to encourage greater faculty engagement.
