State funding for OER/ZTC development and expansion for Z-degrees and certificates has officially been released. The first \$20,000 is now available and the remaining \$180,000 is anticipated to be received in the next month. ZTC Coordinator Cindy Sheaks would like to convene our work group to provide input and feedback on our campus ZTC plan. This will lead to the creation of additional Z-degrees and certificates.
