



Director's Note: When directing *Consagrada*, I didn't just want it to be entertaining, but a lesson for all to have a perspective on how being queer feels and means in a beautiful culture that believes in the importance of gender roles, family, tradition, and machismo (which is a social behavior pattern in which the Latino male exhibits an overbearing attitude to anyone in a position he perceives as inferior to his, demanding complete subservience) without the stereotypes. This play is meant to show that being queer is neither wrong nor a sin, but a different kind of love that is sometimes looked down upon but shouldn't be because it's what a person feels. I would like to thank every cast member who made my first production an experience that made me fall in love with directing and their commitment, dedication, and vulnerability to this production. I would also like to thank my family, closest friends, boyfriend, and Suzanne, as they are the ones who have supported me through the production process. Special Thanks to all Theatre Arts Department Faculty and Staff for making this production possible. They are the ones that make the real magic happen in all the Moorpark College productions!

Playwright Note: Consagrada is many things: a true story, a shared experience, a love and hate letter to the church and all it stands for. There are so many people who have gone through the experience of being cast aside by the church for the crime of living and loving while queer. It is a painful exile from a place that should be welcoming and holy in its inclusivity, but instead excludes people for daring to express their true selves. Hope and peace are what we deserve, but they are not often what we get. I hope that this story helps you to understand a piece of what it is to be queer and a faithful believer in a world that sees those two adjectives as opposites, and I hope you will be inspired to treat your Latin and LGBTQ+ friends with a little more kindness.

Directors' Note for Cognitive Distortion: Mental health is a very sensitive and sometimes triggering topic to talk about. But it is very important to me and a statistic has shown that mental health is on the rise, especially in women. 1 in 5 women experience a mental disorder. There is so much that everyone can experience with mental health. We understand these experiences and what mental health is like. We understand the struggle and the difficulties, and we've been so grateful to impart some of these experiences on the cast and story. This play only covers such a small portion of the variety of mental illnesses. These forms can also lead to different coping mechanisms in an attempt to quell the pain, such as self harm and even suicide.
