# What are Scholarships?

# Financial Aid vs. Scholarships

- Financial Aid: Publicly funded. Can be grants or loans. Apply through FAFSA/CADAA.
- Scholarships: Privately funded. Never have to be repaid. Applications vary.
- You can get both!

# On-Campus vs. Off-Campus Scholarships

- On-Campus scholarships refer to a scholarship or program specific to a college/university.
- **Off-Campus scholarships** are not specific to a college or university. Usually, funds come from an external organization.

- One application → automatically matched to all scholarships you qualify for.
- This is our on-campus scholarship program, exclusive to MC students.



- Admitted, continuing, or transferring MC students.
- Applications available on an annual basis.

- Awards for Fall 2026 Spring 2027
- No late submissions or deadline extensions.

# **Application Overview: Sections**





# Questionnaire

Multiple choice & Yes/No questions.

Major & Field of Study.

Status questions: continuing, transferring, full-time, part-time.



# **Transcript**

Unofficial transcript.

Confirmation of GPA.



# References

Enter name and email.

Your reference gets a link to fill out the recommendation.



# **Essays**

5 Mandatory essays, 300 word maximums each.

Also includes Optional Essays.

# Application Overview: Questionnaire



## Major

- Pick your field of study from a list.
- If you have two majors, list the most relevant one.
- If you're unsure, ask Cristy.

## Student Status (for 2026–2027, not your current year)

- Bachelor at MC: You are starting or continuing a Bachelor's program at Moorpark College.
- Continuing: You are staying at Moorpark College but not in a Bachelor's program.
- Transferring: You will move to a 4-year college or university in Fall 2026 or Spring 2027.

### **Enrollment Status**

- Full-time: Usually 12 or more units per semester. (Some programs count fewer units as full-time.)
- Part-time: Fewer units than full-time for your program.

# **Major-Specific Questions**

- Some questions only apply to certain majors.
- Read them carefully, but it's okay if most answers are "no."

# **Application Overview: Transcript**



# How do I get my transcript?

- You'll upload your unofficial transcript from your MyVCCCD portal
- Step-by-step instructions are in the application and online guide
- Use a transcript that includes your final Fall 2025 grades

### What to look at

- Overall GPA → the GPA you'll report on the application
- Overall Earned Hours → how many units you've completed

# **GPA Requirements**

- Some scholarships have a minimum GPA (usually 2.5–3.0)
- Others don't require a GPA at all

Everyone is encouraged to apply, no matter your GPA!

# **Application Overview: References**



### Reference & Recommenders

- You need at least 1 reference from someone in an academic or professional setting (professor, counselor, supervisor, coworker, community leaders).
- You can list up to 3 references— more is better!

### **Process**

- Enter your reference's name + email in the application.
- They'll get an email with instructions and a special link.
- References complete a short survey and (optionally) upload a letter of recommendation.
- Your application can be submitted before references are finished.
- References deadline: February 4, 2026.

# Suggestions

- Ask early (at least 2 weeks' notice).
- Consider listing 2–3 references to strengthen your application.
- Check in with references to make sure they submit on time.

# Before December

Rita asks Professor Wright and Paige to be her references.

Both agree.



# December 5

Rita enters references into her application.

Professor Wright and Paige receive automated emails with unique PINs.



# January 10

Rita asks Mark to be a last-minute reference.

Mark agrees and Rita adds him to her application.

Mark receives email and PIN.



# January 20

Rita submits her application (student deadline: **January 31**).

She also sends a reminder to Paige.



# **February 4** Final reference deadline.

all three Rita's references are included on her application

MCF application opens.



# Requirements

- 5 essays
- 300 word max each
- The same for every applicant
- All review committes have access to these essays

# Tips

- Start drafting early
- Write your essays in a separate document first, then copy and paste them into the application fields.
- Get feedback at the Scholarship Office or the Writing Center

### 1. Educational Goals Essay

 Explain the relationship between your academic pursuits and career ambitions. What have you already accomplished, and what do you envision for your future?

### 2. Campus Activities Essay

• Describe your involvement in campus life and its impact on your overall experience. What has it meant to you?

### 3. Community Service Essay

• Describe your experience with community service. How has this involvement shaped your personal or professional aspirations?

### 4. Financial Need Essay

 Tell us about a financial challenge you've faced during your education and how it has influenced your approach to your studies.

### 5. Scholarship Impact Essay

• How would receiving this scholarship affect your educational journey? Please share your thoughts.





# **Optional Essays**

- Some scholarships require extra essays.
- Only reviewed for those specific awards.
- Prompts are usually very specific.
- Answer as many or as few as you like. No penalty for skipping.
- You still must meet other eligibility requirements (GPA, major, etc.).

# Examples of Scholarships with Optional Essays

- **ASMC Mental Health Matters Scholarship:** Any major, No GPA requirement, Must be enrolled in at least 3 units.
- Clean Power Alliance Voyager Scholarship: For certain STEM majors, 2.5+ GPA
- Bruce Garber Legacy Scholarship: Any major, 3.2+ GPA

- Prompts are in the online guide
- Get feedback at the Writing Center

# Ask for references early

• Give them time to prepare, at least 2 weeks notice
