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

9n the Spring of 2013, we opened *Henry IV*Parts 1 & 2 on the Moorpark College mainstage and that began a tradition of bringing



Shakespeare to this stage, and our students, at least once during a two-year cycle of shows. When we proposed committing to this Elizabethan effort, Sydney Sims, long time English Department Chair and friend of the Theatre was the first to sign up, and I can't imagine of ever doing a production of Shakespeare without her! Since that time, we have been joined by Musical Director Dave Watkins and Choreographer Nancy Ferraro-Paradis.

Through this growth and transformation, we have been able to give our students a conservatory level experience in classical theatre production that I am not aware of anywhere else at a two-year level. We have also been joined by the Moorpark College Foundation who we are proud to say have embraced the entirety of our Theatre Arts program and have sponsored VIP events for every opening night of our productions year-round.

Of course, you will also be enjoying the work of our Technical Theatre students as well this evening. That Career Education TTHA program, headed by Brian Koehler, Haleh Risdana, Orly Ruiz, Sarah King, Arianna Burrell, Melissa Lay and Krista Lederer has fueled the growth of our two programs to the point that fellow director, *Suzanne* Fagan, and I are able to challenge and empower our students to attain performances that even they didn't know they were capable of. welfth Night has all the delights of a Shakespeare comedy: a shipwreck, mistaken identities, a love triangle, a girl disguised as a boy, drunken singing, lots of marriages. It has some memorable lines, too: "If music be the food of love, play on; "Some are born great, some achieve greatness, and some have greatness thrust upon them;" and my own favorite: "I can hardly forbear hurling things at him!" Setting the play in the Roaring Twenties brings a whole new layer of comedic opportunities: not just galliards but the Charleston; instead of "Come Away, Death," we get "You Made Me Love You." The show closes with "Get Happy," but there are a surprising number of unhappy endings: Sir Antonio's faithful adoration of Sebastian goes unrewarded; poor Sir Andrew, hoping for a wealthy bride, is left with a broken head; and Malvolio stalks offstage vowing "revenge on the whole pack of you." Even in this funny, sunny play, Shakespeare leaves us with some darker shadows to contemplate as we leave the theater.

To give herself time to recover, Viola goes into the service of Count Orsino of Illyria, disguised as a young man named Cesario. Orsino sends Cesario to woo the Lady Olivia on his behalf, but, inconveniently, Olivia falls in love with Cesario. And to complicate things further, Viola has fallen in love with Orsino. Throw in Olivia's drunken kinsman, Sir Toby Belch; his feckless party companion, Sir Andrew Aguecheek; and a professional fool/jester, who have vowed revenge upon Olivia's pompous, tightly-wound steward, Malvolio, and the comedic turmoil begins to unfold. Meanwhile, Sebastian has also survived the wreck and comes to visit Orsino's court along with his rescuer, Antonio. This hilarious romp has been set in the Roaring Twenties and features settings, costumes, music, and dances from the era, bringing a unique take on this classic comedy to the main stage at Moorpark College.
