Instructions & Information

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Who Can Apply

- This scholarship is open to **high school seniors in their Spring semester** who meet one of the following criteria:
 - Attending the **High School at Moorpark College (HSMC)**.
 - Attending a high school in Ventura County and either
 - Currently taking or have previously taken **Moorpark College dual-enrollment classes**.
 - OR
 - Have a history of courses at **Moorpark College** or within the **Ventura County Community College District (VCCCD)**.
- Applications from students who do **not** meet these criteria will not be reviewed.
- Meeting eligibility requirements does **not** guarantee a scholarship.

Before You Start

- The application must be completed by **you**, the student.
- Help is allowed only for **technical** or **accessibility** needs.
- You may use AI tools to **brainstorm** or **refine**, but responses must be **your own work and voice**.
- Submitting work that is not your own may disqualify your application.
- You must have the following ready to upload:
 - A PDF of **your high school transcript with grades through Fall 2025**
 - A PDF of **your unofficial VCCCD or Moorpark College transcript with grades through Fall 2025**

Saving Your Progress

- Your answers **auto-save** each time you respond to a question.
- You can log out and return at any time.
- The system logs out after **45 minutes of inactivity**, but your progress is saved whenever you answer a question or change pages.

Submitting Your Application

- You **cannot edit** your application after submitting it.
- All applications must be submitted by **Sunday, March 15, 2026 at 11:59 PM**
- **Late submissions will not be accepted.**
- Make sure all required questions and both transcripts are uploaded **before** submitting.

1. Log in to your MyVCCCD portal.
2. Navigate to "Student Records" in the menu and select "Unofficial Academic Transcript."
3. Your unofficial transcript will open in a new webpage.
4. On the webpage, click the printer icon on the right-hand side, as if you were going to print it.
5. Instead of printing, select "Save as PDF" and download the file.
6. Upload the downloaded PDF of your unofficial transcript to your scholarship application.
7. **Remember:** Your transcript must have finalized Fall 2025 grades

Essays

Scholarship Essay Instructions

- All applicants are required to complete **all three essays**.
- Each essay has a **300-word maximum** (about half a page).
- You may work on drafts outside of the application (on Word, Google Docs, Pages, etc.) and copy/paste your final version into the application later.

Tips for Writing Your Essays:

- **Be specific:** Use concrete examples from your experiences.
- **Reflect thoughtfully:** Explain what you learned or how it shaped your thinking.
- **Write in your own voice:** Your perspective matters most.
- **Proofread carefully:** Check your work for clarity, grammar, and spelling - it makes a big difference!
- **Focus on impact and clarity:** Especially in the Financial Impact Essay, show how support would make a real difference.
- **Don't go it alone:** Ask a teacher, counselor, tutor, or writing center for guidance if you need it.

Prompts:

1. Educational Goals Essay

- Describe what you are studying or plan to study.
- Explain why you chose this subject.
- Share what you hope to do in your career or future.

- This essay helps us understand your **goals and direction**.

2. Leadership & Community Essay

- Describe your involvement in school or community activities, including clubs, programs, volunteer work, or other ways you've contributed.
- Highlight any times you led something, helped others, or made a difference.
- Reflect on what you learned from these experiences and how you hope to carry these lessons forward into college, your career, or future endeavors.
- This essay helps us understand how you **engage with your community and how that shapes your future goals**.

3. Financial Impact Essay

- Describe a financial challenge that affects your schoolwork or ability to reach your goals.
- Explain how this challenge impacts your education.
- Share how receiving this scholarship would help and the difference it would make.
- This essay helps us see **how our support could help you succeed**.
