DUAL ENROLLMENT

Moorpark College’s Dual Enrollment Program provides K12 students the opportunity to earn college credits before graduating high school to expand college and career readiness. Unlike AP courses that serve honors students, often those with college already on their horizon, dual enrollment brings college to students who would not have previously considered attending. It helps students learn that college is for them and builds a pipeline to Moorpark College where they can later matriculate and complete programs that lead to high-wage jobs.



GROWTH, STUDENT ENROLLMENT, AND SUCCESS (2018-2024)

In the 2018-2019 school year, Moorpark College’s Dual Enrollment Program served 1,315 K-12 students with an 86.9% course success rate. In the 2023-24 school year, 3,177 students participated in dual enrollment courses through Moorpark College with an 88.7% success rate. In the 2018-19 academic year, 14 certificates and degrees were awarded to dual enrollment students. In the 2023-2024 academic year, 64 certificates and degrees were awarded to dual enrollment students. In fall 2018, 225 of the students engaged in dual enrollment in the 2018-2019 academic year matriculated to Moorpark College and in fall 2024 389 of the dually enrolled students in the 2023-2024 academic year matriculated to the college.



DUAL ENROLLMENT PARTNERSHIPS & COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Over the past year, Moorpark College has participated in several communities of practice with our K12 partners, administrators, and dual enrollment faculty to work towards developing viable Career Access Pathways (CCAP). We have met individually with our K12 partners' superintendents, principals, and counselors to discuss possible pathways that meet the needs of their student populations. One of the college's more successful partnerships delivers Computer Network System Engineering courses to Santa Paula High School. The college is in the process of developing a cybersecurity pathway that leads to a high-wage careers enabling students to live and work in Ventura County.

CONCLUSION

Dual enrollment is committed to creating College and Career Access Pathways (CCAP) with our K-12 partners, to develop seamless pathways from high school to Moorpark College. With an equity lens, we aim to create a college-going culture for students who may not have thought of themselves as college graduates while meeting the Vision 2030 goal of ensuring high school students graduate with 12 units of college credit. As a way to close equity gaps, changing more of the non-CCAP courses to CCAP will ensure that disproportionately impacted students, who are low-income, can afford to enroll in courses, as CCAP allows dual enrollment students to have their college fees and textbooks paid for.

This fall the college's Dean's Council has added dual enrollment to its weekly agenda to promote collaboration and focus to help the college make progress towards its dual enrollment goals.

GOALS

- Develop a Cybersecurity CCAP Pathway and implement it in FA26 at one high school campus.
- Develop a CCAP GE Pathway and implement at one high school campus in FA26.
- Develop a non-CCAP GE Pathway and implement in FA26 at two high school campuses.




