## UC TRANSFER and IGETC INFORMATION MOORPARK COLLEGE - 2015-2016

### What is the IGETC?

The Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) is a series of courses prospective transfer students attending a California Community College (CCC) may complete to satisfy the lower division General Education (GE) requirements at both the University of California (UC) and California State University (CSU). Many independent/private and out-of-state colleges and universities will also accept the IGETC.

**Note:** Students transferring to a CSU campus may choose to use the CSU GE pattern in lieu of IGETC.

### Is IGETC required for transfer to a UC or CSU campus?

**No.** IGETC is *not* an admission requirement for transfer to either the UC or CSU, nor does completing it guarantee admission to the campus or program of choice. IGETC may *not* be best for students in high unit majors such as math and sciences, and some UC campuses will not accept IGETC for certain majors.

### What are the minimum UC requirements for an upper-division transfer student?

1. Complete 60 semester units of UC transferable college credit with a 2.4 (2.8 for nonresidents) grade point average. The 60 semester UC transferable units should include general education below (2A or 2B), lower-division major preparations and/or electives.

2. Complete either: A) IGETC or B) the following 7-course pattern by the end of the spring term prior to fall enrollment at UC and earning a grade of C or better in each course. Each course must be worth at least 3 semester (4 quarter) units:

- Two UC transferable college courses in English composition;
- One UC transferable college course in mathematical concepts and quantitative reasoning;
- Four transferable college courses chosen from at least two of the following subject areas: the arts and humanities, the social and behavioral sciences, and the physical and biological sciences.

All campuses recommend that the student complete math and English as early as possible (some highly recommend completing them by the end of the fall term, one year prior to enrolling at UC).

Keep in mind that meeting these basic requirements does not guarantee admission to the campus or major of choice. To be as competitive as possible, students should work toward meeting the requirements for the campuses and majors they're interested in.

### What is IGETC certification?

"Certification" refers to official notification from Moorpark College that a student transferring to any UC/CSU campus has completed courses fulfilling lower-division general education requirements.

To obtain full certification, a student must complete 34-37 (UC/CSU) units in the designed general education areas (Areas 1-6).

### Is partial IGETC certification available?

**Yes**, partial IGETC certification is permitted where a maximum of two (2) IGETC courses may be completed after transfer (excluding Areas 1 and 2). **NOTE:** deficiencies in IGETC Areas 1 and/or 2 may indicate a student does not meet minimum transfer admission requirements.

### What is the minimum grade requirement for IGETC certification?

A minimum "C" grade is required in each college course for IGETC. C- is not acceptable, except in meeting the Language Other Than English requirement (Area 6A).

**NOTE:** The UC system allows a maximum of 14 semester units graded "Pass/No Pass" basis of the 60 transferable semester units required for admission.

### Can external credit examinations be applied to IGETC?

**Yes.** Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate (IB) exams may be included in the IGETC certification of general education requirements in accordance with the IGETC Standards Version 1.5, 2014. Students wishing to use units awarded for AP or IB should check with a MC counselor or refer to the current MC catalog pages on **Credit by Examination** that indicate equivalent general education area or elective units that could apply with appropriate scores.

### Is the IGETC certification the same for both CSU and UC?

**No.** Full certification for CSU must include Oral Communication (Area 1C). Full certification for a UC campus must include satisfaction of the foreign language proficiency (Area 6).

### Does the UC have a History, Constitution and American Ideals graduation requirement?

**Yes** however, most students will have satisfied this requirement through one year of U.S. history or one half year of U.S. history and one half year of U.S. government in high school completed with a "C" or better.

### Can coursework from other colleges be used on the IGETC?

**Yes.** Moorpark College will certify courses taken at other CCC and these courses will be placed in the same IGETC category identified at the offering college. Courses taken at other regionally accredited colleges/universities that do not have an IGETC pattern may be used on IGETC if the course is deemed comparable to an approved IGETC course at MC or another CCC. **Foreign coursework can NOT be used for IGETC.**

### Can a Course be used to satisfy an IGETC requirement and major requirement?

**Yes.** A course may be used for both requirements for most majors on most UC/CSU campuses, but there may be exceptions to this rule. Please check with a MC counselor or at [www.assist.org](http://www.assist.org) for more information.

### What is ASSIST?

The **Articulation System Stimulating Interinstitutional Student Transfer (ASSIST)** is an online student-transfer information system that shows how course credits earned at one public California college/university can be applied when transferred to another. ASSIST provides the most accurate and up-to-date information about student transfer in California and can be accessed at [www.assist.org](http://www.assist.org)

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**CAVEAT** – the information and transfer requirements provided are subject to change. For more information, students should consult a MC counselor or appropriate websites to receive the most current and up-to-date transfer information
