

California State University General Education Requirements

Certification Pattern

CERTIFICATION: "Certification" means that Moorpark College has verified that a student has completed the lower division General Education requirements for the California State University. It is important because the requirements differ slightly from campus to campus. Once "certified", the CSU campus of choice will know that the student has completed requirements as articulated between the CSU and Moorpark College (9 units of upper division General Education courses must be completed after transfer). Courses from other schools may be considered by catalogue evaluation. Please see a Moorpark Counselor for assistance. It is the student's responsibility to request "certification".

MINIMUM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS: A student must complete 56 (60 for Fall 2005) or more transferable units with a minimum GPA of 2.0 "C" or better (2.4 for non-residents), be in good standing at the last college or university attended, and have completed or made up missing college preparatory subject requirements. Missing college preparatory course requirements may be made up by: high school graduates prior to 1987 may qualify for admission by completing with grades C or better each course of the CSU general education requirements in Communication in the English Language (at least 9 semester units) and mathematics (usually 3 semester units), or 1988 and later high school graduates may complete with a grade C or better in each course a minimum of 30 semester (45 quarter) units selected from courses in English, Arts and Humanities, Social Science, Science, and Mathematics of at least equivalent level to courses that meet general education or transfer curriculum requirements. All CSU general education requirements in Communication in the English Language (at least 9 semester units) and in Mathematics (usually 3 semester units) must be completed as part of the 30-semester unit requirement. The remainder of the units can be selected from any of the designated areas.

Certain programs for which there are more applicants than there are spaces available, i.e. impacted programs, have additional screening requirements. See your Moorpark counselor for details.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT INFORMATION: The following Advanced Placement examinations may be incorporated into certification of completion of CSU General Education-Breadth requirements by any participating institution. Students must have scored 3, 4, or 5 on an Advanced Placement examination to receive credit. Individual CSU campuses may choose to accept more units than those specified below towards completion of General Education-Breadth requirements. The CSU campus to which the student is transferring determines the total number of units awarded for successful completion of an Advanced Placement Examination and the applicability of the examination to other graduation requirements.

Certification and Double Counting

Executive Order (E.O.) No. 167 delegates to the California Community Colleges the authority to identify baccalaureate courses applicable to the CSU executive Order No. 595 authorizes the California Community Colleges to designate courses that fulfill the General Education-Breadth requirements. Since 1982, community colleges also have been authorized to designate, using the provisions of E.O. no. 405, community college courses that fulfill the U.S. history, constitution and American ideals requirement. Although graduation requirements vary among CSU campuses, community colleges can ensure maximum compatibility between community college courses and CSU lower division requirements through utilization of the certification process.

All CSU campuses allow applicants who submit full or area certification to double count courses for general education and minor requirements.

Most CSU campuses allow double counting for general education and major requirements to applicants who submit either full or partial certification. Exceptions are indicated below.

Bakersfield - Courses can be dbl. counted if articulated; **Channel Islands** - Some dbl. counting is permitted; **Chico** - Dbl. counting is generally not permitted for students in a special major; **Dominguez Hills** - Dbl. counting is permitted for lower division; **Fresno** - Dbl. counting is subject to departmental approval. A maximum of two courses may be dbl. counted for most majors; **Fullerton** - Dbl. counting is permitted, except in Business Administration, Communications, Psychology, and Radio/TV/Film majors; **Hayward** - Dbl. counting is permitted for lower division courses; **Humboldt** - Dbl. counting is generally not permitted in the Interdisciplinary Studies major; **Monterey Bay** - Dbl. counting is subject to departmental approval; **Northridge** - Limited dbl. counting is permitted in specific majors; **Sacramento** - Dbl. counting is limited to six lower division units in major subject areas and three units with minor; **San Bernardino** - Dbl. counting is permitted except for philosophy and communication majors; **San Francisco** - Total of 12 units in major and GE to overlap in either upper or lower division; **San Luis Obispo** - Dbl. counting is permitted; **San Marcos** - Dbl. counting is permitted; **Sonoma** - Some dbl. counting is permitted; **Stanislaus** - Dbl. counting is limited to lower division courses.

All campuses allow double counting of courses taken to meet General Education-Breadth and the American Institutions requirement for applicants who are either fully or partially certified.

*NOTE: Students with IGETC certification cannot double count courses taken to meet IGETC and the American Institutions requirement.
